EDLR 1110. Introduction to Sport Management. (3 Credits)

EDLR 1161. Husky Reads: Introducing Food and Nutrition to Children through Reading. (2 Credits)

(Also offered as NUSC 1161.) Supervised field work and experiential learning in nutritional literacy for preschoolers and young children, geared to individual, dual, and team activities. Readings and reflections. **Enrollment Requirements:** Instructor consent.

EDLR 1162. Health and Education in Urban Communities. (1 Credit)

Historical and social forces that shape health and education in Connecticut's urban communities. Poverty, culture, and identity; their impacts on children's health, nutrition, schooling, and opportunities for success. Analysis of social policies, norms, and beliefs; their impact on issues of justice. Includes service learning.

EDLR 3300W. Sport in Society. (3 Credits)

Sport as an institution. Sociological issues involving gender, race, and intercollegiate, professional, and children's sports.

Enrollment Requirements: SOCI 1001 or 1251; ENGL 1007 or 1010 or 1011 or 2011; open to Sports Management majors only. Skill Codes: COMP. Writing Competency

Enrollment Requirements: EDLR 3310; open only to students in the Sports Management Program.
