more than three credits may be for POLS 3991 Supervised Field Work) can be counted toward the 24 credits.

Related Courses

At least 12 credits in courses related to Political Science taken from one or more other departments. These courses must be numbered 2000 or higher and cannot be taken on a pass-fail basis. All 2000-level (or higher) courses in Anthropology, Economics, Geography, History, Human Rights, Philosophy, Public Policy and Sociology will meet this requirement. Any course within these departments that is cross-listed with POLS will count towards the major and not as a related. Certain other courses have been approved and are listed on polisci.uconn.edu (http://polisci.uconn.edu). Courses not in the departments listed above or included on the preapproved list may be approved as related courses at the discretion of the advisor.
