MEDIEVAL STUDIES MINOR

Requirements

Students must complete at least five upper-level courses in Medieval Studies disciplines, for a total of 15 credits. No more than three of these credits may be transferred from another college or university. Coursework must be at the 2000 level and above, and may also include Variable Topics, Special Topics, Independent Study, Foreign Study, and graduatelevel courses, as determined by the course content and consent of one of the Minor Advisors.
