

THERAPEUTIC HORSEMANSHIP EDUCATION MINOR

This minor provides students with an opportunity to pursue an interest in therapeutic riding programs, and provides a basis for further study and certification as a therapeutic riding instructor or director. Riding experience at Intermediate Level II is required to enroll in ANSC 4457 Methods of Equitation Instruction, one of the required courses of this minor.

At least 12 of the credits taken to satisfy the minor must be from courses that are not required for the student's major or other minors within the College of Agriculture, Health and Natural Resources.
